Plan Ahead

Have your roof inspected – and upgrade to high-performance shingles if possible.

Stay indoors, away from skylights and doors.

Close windows and drapes to prevent broken glass from flying inside.



Driving During a Hailstorm



Stop driving as soon as you can. If possible, pull into a garage or under a shelter. Don't seek shelter under an overpass or bridge.

Don't leave your vehicle until it stops hailing.

If you can't avoid driving, turn on your headlights (low beams) and slow down to allow extra distance for braking.

> Hail can be a warning sign for tornadoes. If the sky darkens and wind intensifies, park, stay buckled up and cover your head for protection.
