Here are some items to include:



MEAL PREPARATION

A 3-day supply of nonperishable food



1 gallon of bottled water per person per day for 3 days

Paper cups, plates, utensils and paper towels



EMERGENCY TOOLS



Battery-operated flashlight, radio and extra batteries

Fire extinguisher



A multipurpose tool to turn off utilities

Matches in a waterproof container



Duct tape

MEDICAL SUPPLIES



First-aid supplies

Prescriptions and other medications



ESSENTIALS

Blankets, clothing, toiletries



Cash – ATMs may not work during a power outage

All important documents in a safe, dry container



COMMUNICATION NECESSITIES

Battery-operated charger for your cellphone and other electronic devices



Contact information for emergency services, family, friends, neighbors and insurance company, in your phone



Add supplies based on your family's needs.

Infant formula and diapers

Pet supplies: food, water, medications and an extra leash

Items for the elderly or disabled



Remember to restock your kit after using it so it's ready for the future.



Check your supply kit from time to time and make sure nothing has expired.
